European History: HIS 317, 318, 335, 338, 341, 348, 350World History: HIS 302, 304, 326, 339, 342, 350, 353

Wold History: HIS 306, 326, 339, 342, 350, 353

## <u>Special notes:</u> Students <u>must</u> take HIS 220 during the fall semester of their sophomore year.

HIS 302 and HIS 342 may count as either United States History or World History. HIS 350 may count as either European History or World History. HIS 306, 326, 329, 338, and 342 are cross-listed with PSI.
